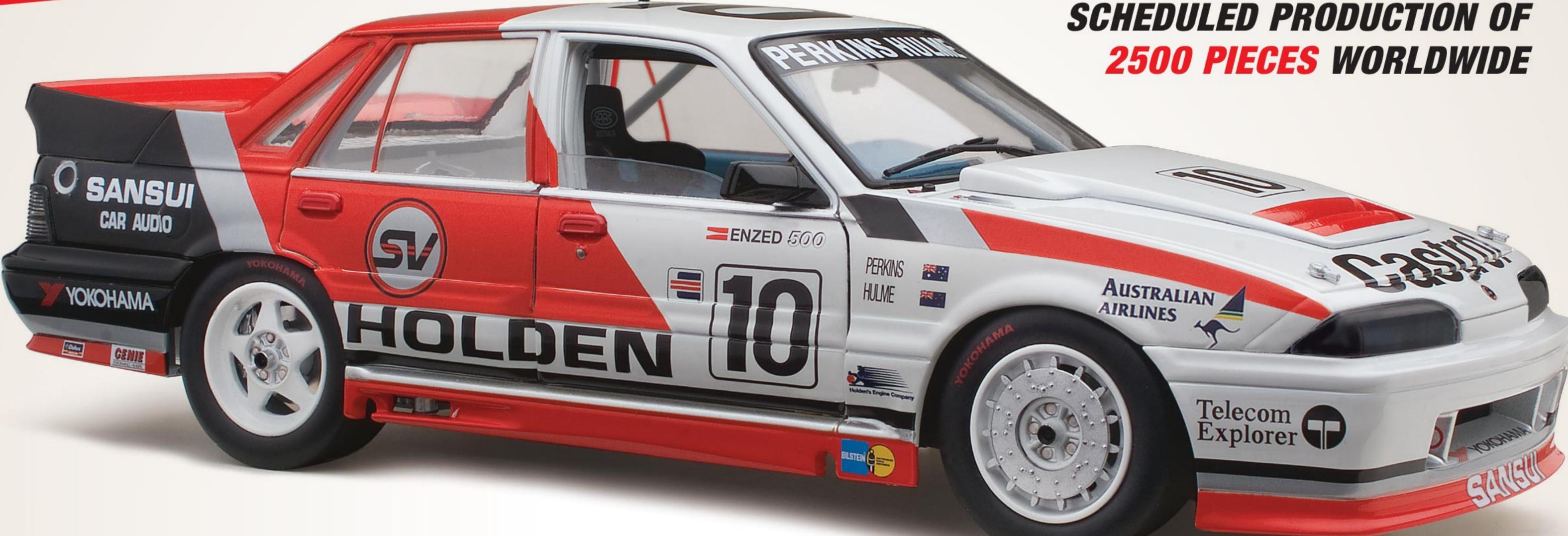

NEW TOOLING 1988 SANDOWN 2ND PLACE HOLDEN YL COMMODORE

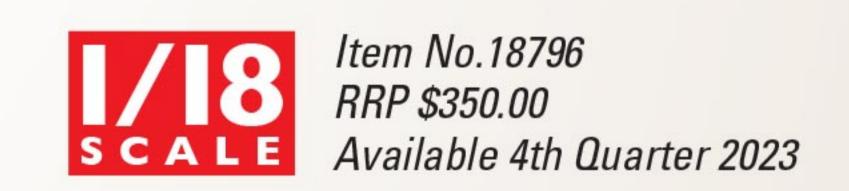


The Holden VL SS Group A was built for racing.

The debut of the Holden VL Commodore SS Group A came from Garry Willmington at Oran Park's Pepsi 250. But the car was severely underdone and the car retired after just 4 laps.

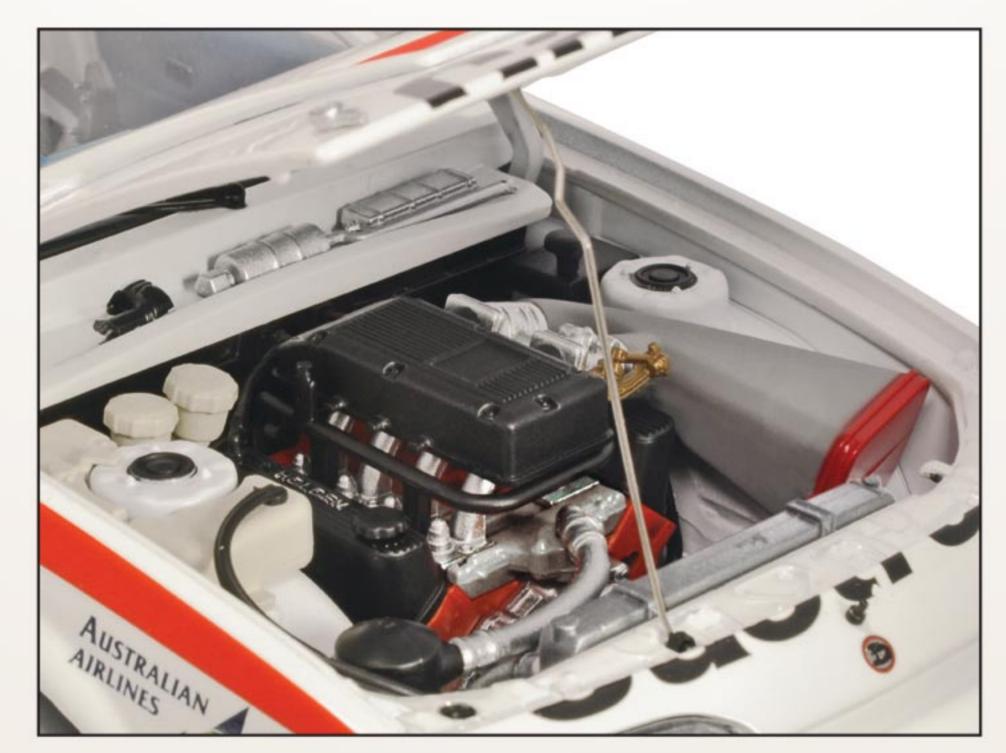
Two weeks later HSV debuted their new VL Commodore at the Enzed Sandown 500. Two cars were entered from the HSV team, number 10, driven by Larry Perkins and Denny Hulme, with the number 11 car driven by Jeff Allam and Armin Hahne, both HSV cars were Perkins built. The HSV team had a promising start with both qualifying in the top 10.

The number 10 car was able lead in its debut race for 30 laps, before a slow pad change allowed Allan Moffat and Gregg Hansford in a Ford Sierra RS500 to build an unassailable lead. The Allam/Hahne paring failed to finish, retiring after 56 laps, while the Perkins/Hulme car finished the race in 2nd place.

The engine bay has an outstanding level of detail including a metal bonnet support.

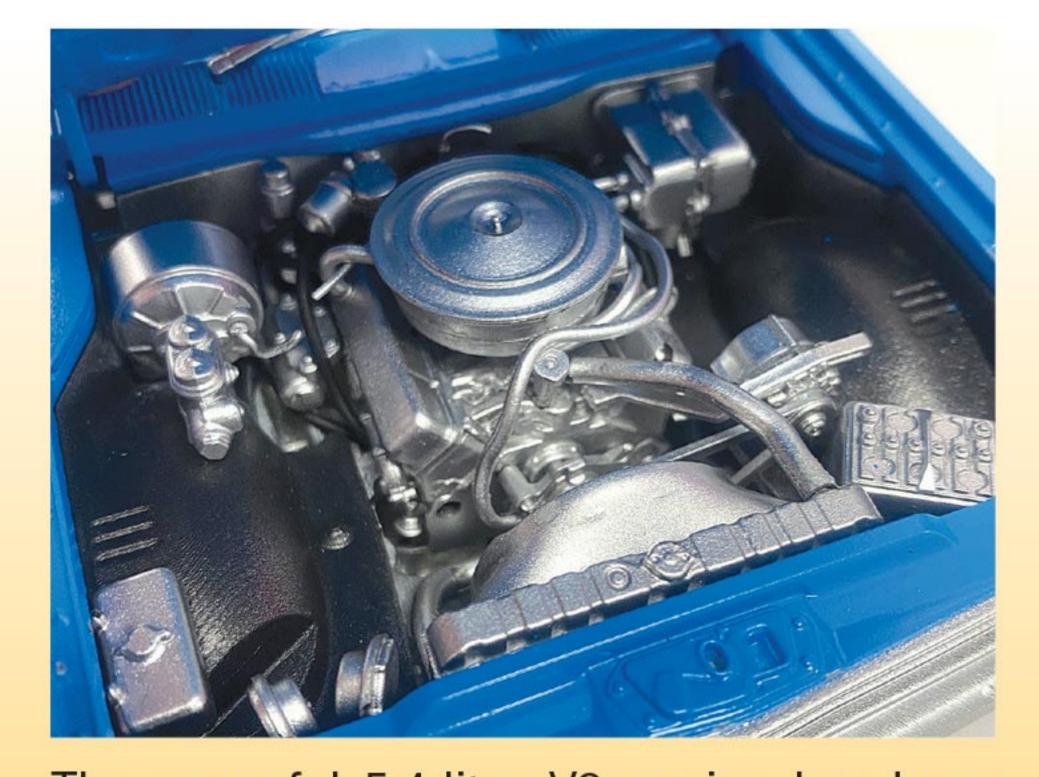


The sparse race car interior includes a switch tower. Note the arm rests are removed from the doors.

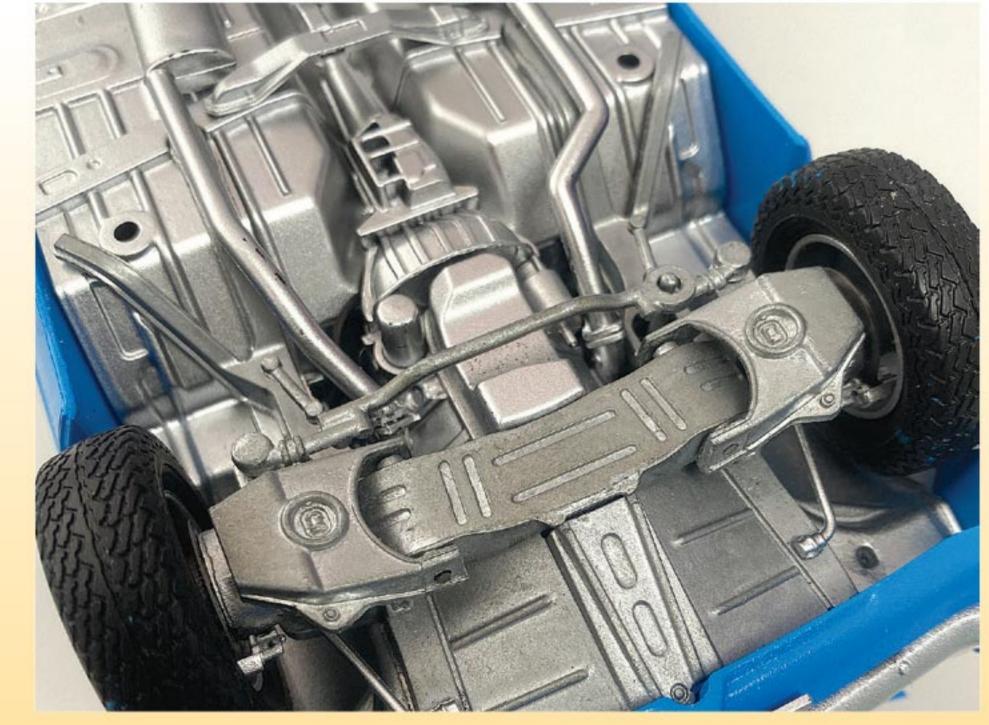

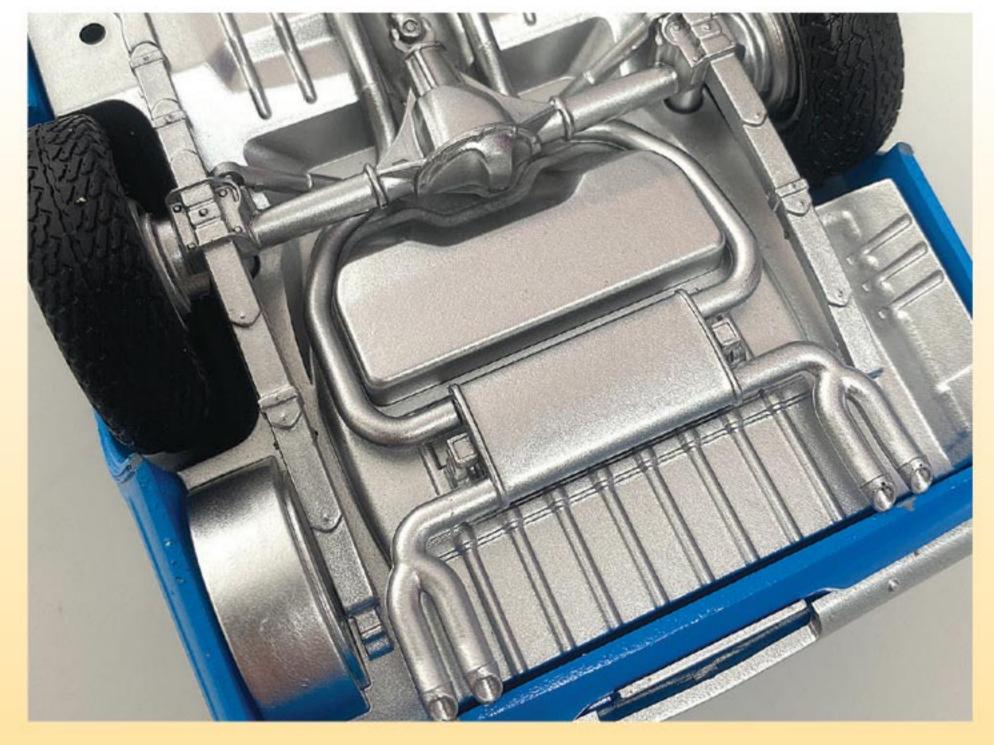

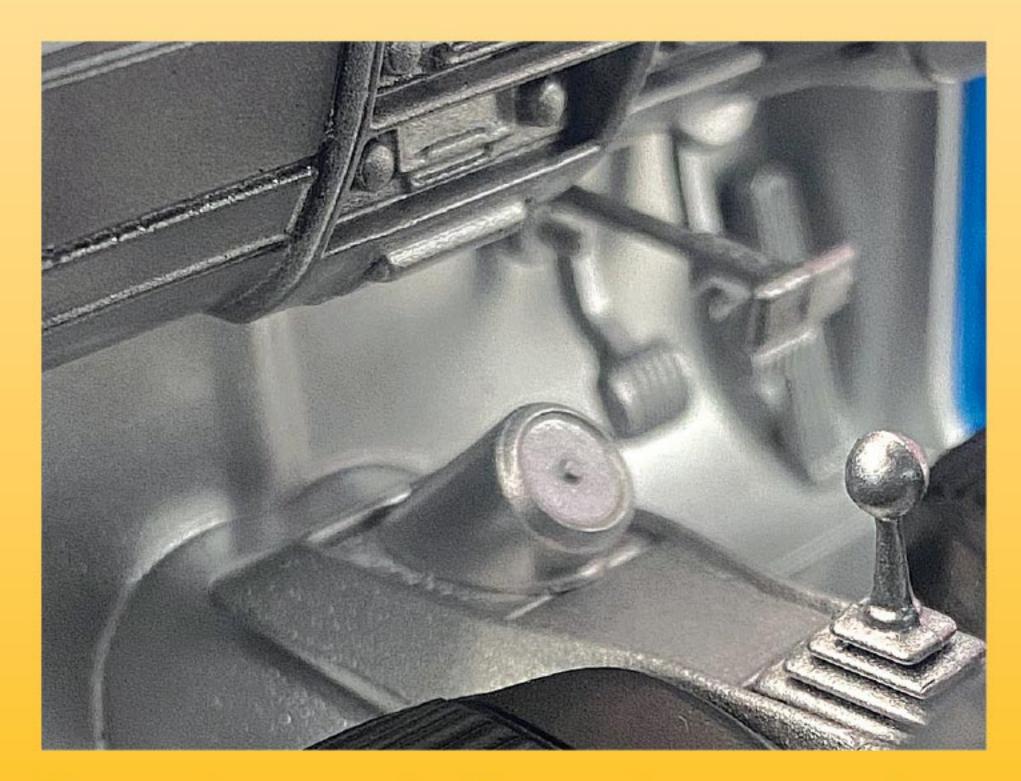
The powerful 5.4-litre V8 engine has been replicated in great detail on this model.

The Holden FC was a great achievement for Holden, introduced on the 6th of May 1958. The model was extremely popular, at its peak the model had over 50% of the market share. In the production of the FC it was the first time Holden had produced more than 100,000 units in a year. Holden created a major millstone with the FC when on October 22nd 1958 it became the 500,000 Holden produced. The Managing Director Earl C Daum presented the car (a Station Sedan) to the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

As with previous Holden models, the FC was a revised version of previous model. The revision of a model half way through its life helped maintain interest and sales. The FC was an improved version of the FE.

The most notable upgrades were to the external body, with chrome trim now dominating the side of the car. The front grille was much bolder with the front indicators now incorporated into the front bumper, chrome tail fins were also a new addition to the rear of the car. The interior also had a make over with new door liner and seat trim. The steering wheel featured a half ring horn to give greater visibility of the instruments which also had an upgrade, with a shroud around the dials to reduce reflections.

After a production run of 191,724 vehicles, in January 1960 the FC was replaced by an all new model the Holden FB.

HOLDEN EH PANEL VAN









Released in 1963, the EH has was one of Australia's most popular selling cars. With a new engine, clever styling changes, and competitively priced, the EH was the fastest selling car in Australia. Catering to a wide audience, it was available in nine different models, two of those models were built as working cars, the Utility and Panel van.



The 'Standard' interior features the highly detailed steering wheel and instrument cluster.



Detailed 149cui engine and bay looks authentic. The bonnet is aided by the metal hinges.

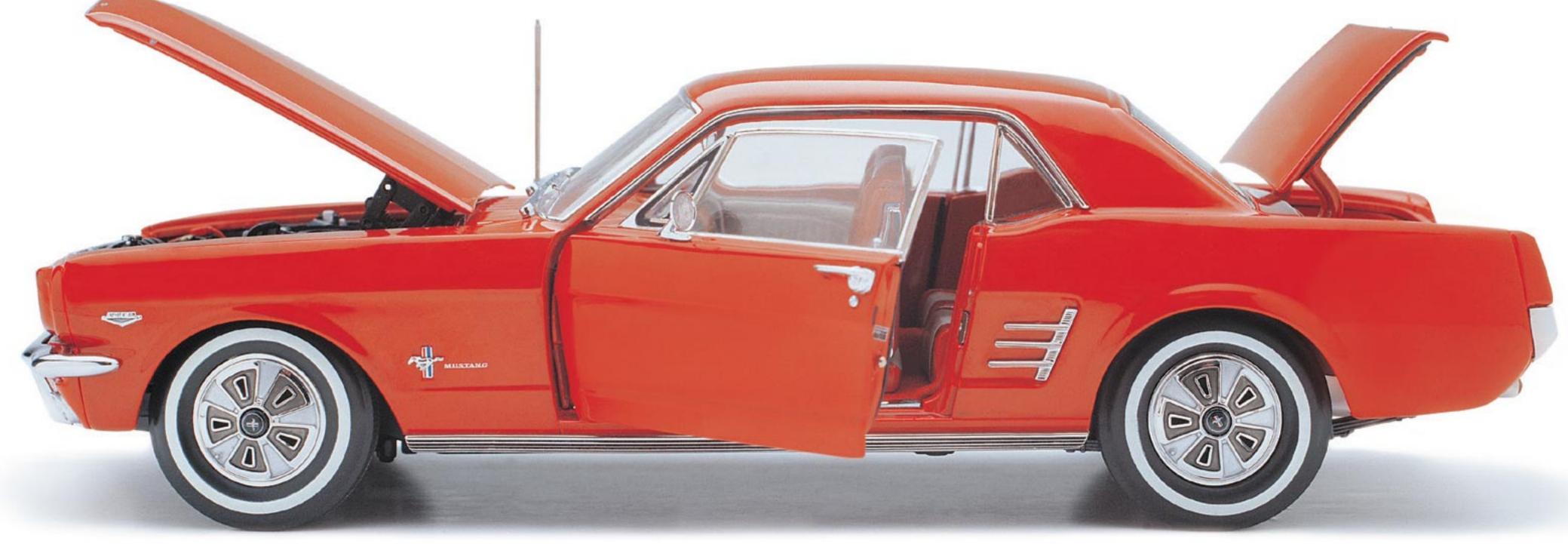


The rear tailgate features metal telescopic arms and retaining cables, just like the real car.

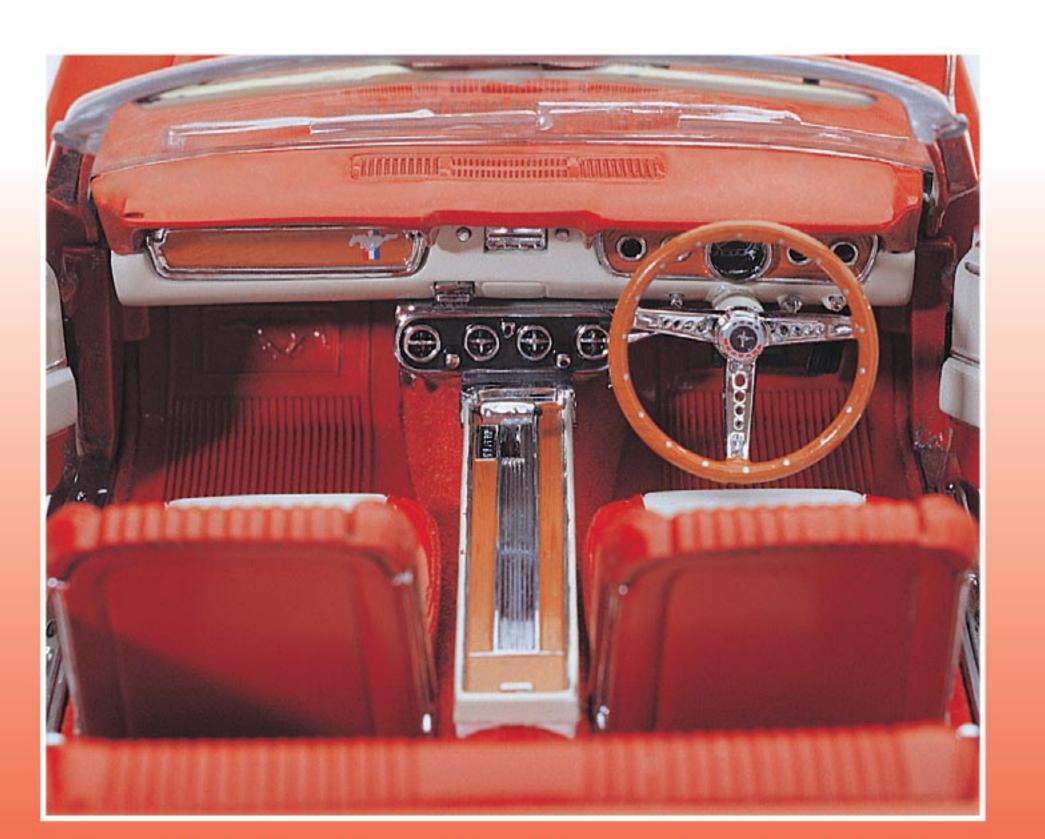

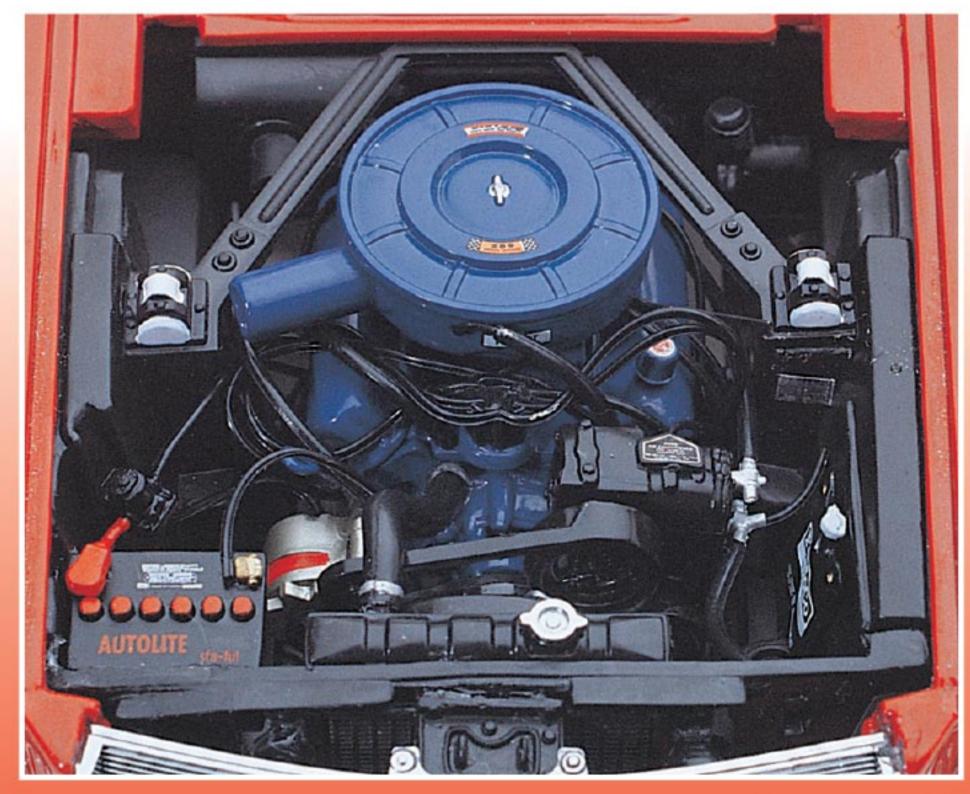

Supply the demand! This was Ford's goal for 1966 and close to 700,000 Mustangs were built in an extended model year. A new deluxe interior featuring the galloping pony seat inserts served to continue its popularity. Instead of a separate luxury model, Ford decided to offer a set of luxury options. These options were given the name 'Interior Decor Group'. Most noticeable of these features was the galloping pony inserts on the seats. For this reason, the Interior Decor Group is often referred to as the 'Pony' interior. These special interiors were also known as Deluxe or Luxury interiors.
